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Supreme Court Cases

- **Zubic v. Burwell** (Affordable Care Act mandate that employers provide insurance for contraceptives)
- Universal Health Services v. U.S. (interpretation of the federal False Claims Act in a case involving false Medicaid claims)
- Luis v. U.S. (freezing of financial assets in a case involving a fraud prosecution of a home health agency)
- Whole Woman's Health v. Hellerstedt (legality of Texas abortion statute)

Bonus Cases

- Florida "Docs v. Glocks" case involving Florida statute limiting the right of physicians to ask their patients about guns in the home
- U.S. House of Representatives v. Burwell (testing the president's authority to subsidize insurers for the losses sustained by selling individual policies on the marketplaces)
