- ***Armstrong v. Exceptional Child Center, Inc.*** (Can a Medicaid provider sue the state for inadequate reimbursement rates?)
- ***North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners v. Federal Trade Commission*** (FTC enforcing antitrust laws)
- ***Young v. United Parcel Service*** (Young alleged UPS violated Pregnancy Discrimination Act.)
