at The Florida State University

You have options.

Get started on your career in medicine and while you're at it pick any B.S. degree program. Enjoy the opportunity to build early relationships in the College of Medicine.

Through the FSU Honors Medical Scholars Program, you can become eligible for early admission to the FSU College of Medicine upon completion of premed requirements, making it possible in some cases to graduate with your B.S. and M.D. degrees in seven years.

As an undergraduate student:

Take a front-row seat for the Honors Medical Scholars Seminar and take part in a mentorship program, premed prerequisite courses, medical/community volunteer activities and premed organizations.

Requirements for admission to the B.S. phase:

- This highly competitive program is open to a limited number of graduating high school students. **To ensure that your application is considered, you must apply for undergraduate admission to FSU by October 14, 2009.***
- Three admissions are required: 1) by the University as a freshman for the following fall, 2) by the FSU Honors Program,** and 3) by the College of Medicine Honors Medical Scholars Program.
- Students admitted to the Honors Program will receive access to the Honors Medical Scholars Program Application. Consideration for the Honors Medical Scholars Program includes the application and invitation-only interview.



Requirements for admission to the M.D. phase:

- Successful participation in Honors Medical Scholars Program activities.
- FSU B.S. program completion, including medical school prerequisites.
- 3.5 overall GPA.
- Score of 26 or higher on MCAT.
- Successful application and interview with College of Medicine admissions.
