» Two Florida State University biology professors — Gregory Erickson and David Houle — recently received one of the top honors in the scientific world: elevation to the rank of fellow by the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Election as a fellow of the AAAS is an honor bestowed upon association members by their peers. Fellows are recognized for meritorious efforts to advance science or its applications.

Erickson is one of the world's foremost authorities on vertebrate paleontology and has published nearly 100 scientific articles on the subject.

Houle is a highly regarded evolutionary biologist trained in genetics.
