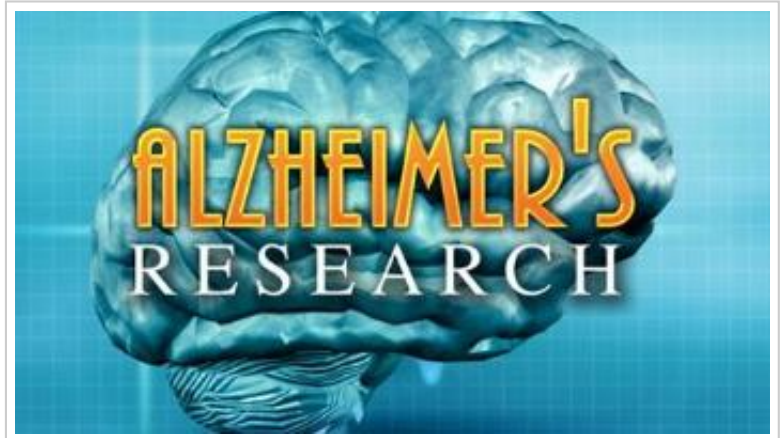




Fraternities Present Check to FSU College of Medicine Alzheimer's Fund

Tallahassee, FL - FSU students have been dancing for money. They were raising funds for great causes.

Fraternity members presented the FSU College of Medicine with an \$11,000 check Wednesday.

The money was raised through the Line Dance Competition held by five fraternities and sororities earlier this month.

Wednesday's check to the College of Medicine specifically goes toward the Alexander "Sandy" Halperin Alzheimer's Research Fund.

The groups raised more than \$40,000. The rest of the money will go to the Student Disability Resource Center and FSU's Victim Advocate Program. Thanks to last-minute contributions, the Alzheimer's Fund will actually get around \$13,000.
