# UM, FIU, NSU among best graduate schools for Hispanic students

The University of Miami, Florida International University and Nova Southeastern University were among six Florida universities recognized by *Hispanic Business* for having top graduate programs for Hispanic students.

The magazine created a Top 10 list for graduate schools in four categories: law, business, engineering and medicine. A university from Florida was represented on each of the lists. UM was on three of the lists, only the second university to do so this year.

Florida International University had the second-ranked law school for Hispanic students. Hispanics accounted for 43 percent of its graduate enrollment, 42 percent of its degrees and 32 percent of its faculty. The University of Miami was third with Hispanics making up 21 percent of its graduate enrollment, 14 percent of its law degrees and 14 percent of its faculty.

Florida State University was fifth. Hispanics accounted for 10 percent of its graduate enrollment, 12 percent of its law degrees and 13 percent of its faculty. Nova Southeastern University was eighth with Hispanics representing 23 percent of its graduate enrollment, 19 percent of its law degrees and 9 percent of its faculty.

American University had the top-ranked law school for Hispanic students.

The UM School of Business ranked ninth for best business schools for Hispanic students. It reported that 18 percent of its graduate students were Hispanic, 13 percent of its MBA degrees were earned by Hispanic students and 19 percent of its faculty were Hispanic.

FIU was 10<sup>th</sup> in the business school category. Hispanics accounted for 48 percent of its graduate students, 43 percent of its MBA degrees and 19 percent of its MBA faculty.

The top-ranked business school for Hispanic students is at the University of Texas at El Paso.

UM ranked fifth for best medical school for Hispanic students. Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of its enrollment, 12 percent of its medical graduates and 24 percent of its faculty. FSU

was ninth with Hispanics representing 14 percent of its enrollment, 15 percent of its medical graduates and 3 percent of its faculty.

*Hispanic Business* said the University of California San Francisco had the top medical school for Hispanic students.

Georgia Tech was ranked as the top engineering school for Hispanic students. The University of Central Florida was fourth and the University of Florida was seventh.
