Medical researcher wins grant for \$1.2M

A Florida State University College of Medicine researcher has been awarded a \$1.2 million grant to explore the role of centrosomes and cilia in cell division and development and their connections to human disease. Tim Megraw, a veteran researcher who joined the College of Medicine as an associate professor in August, received the four-year grant from the National Institutes of Health this month.
