Grievance Policy

The following grievance procedure is posted on the Tobacco Treatment Specialist Training Foundation Course website (located at www.med.fsu.edu/healthaffairs/ahec/tts).

The FSU College of Medicine AHEC Program Office thanks you for your participation in our Tobacco Treatment Specialist Training. We are committed to providing a quality learning experience. The following procedures are designed to provide a process for you to share concerns and grievances regarding the registration, training, learning environment, faculty and training staff.

If you feel there is inappropriate conduct, behavior or activity all or in part by any member of the faculty, training staff or event organizers you have the right to file a grievance (see exhibit A) explaining your concerns/issues. This grievance will be handled in a private and professional manner free from retribution or other adverse action. The grievance must be filed within 30 calendar days of the completion of the TTS 3-Day course. A reply acknowledging receipt of the filed grievance will be made within 72 business hours. Based on the nature of the grievance an investigation will be conducted and a report of action will be provided within 14 business days of the filed grievance. If the report of action is not satisfactory to all parties, a final grievance report may be filed with:
