Doctors and researchers at Florida State University (FSU) study diseases and other health problems. Our goal is to find better treatments for these health problems. To do this, we need the help of people who are willing to be in a research study.

The purpose of this study is to learn more about Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and to test whether repetitive Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (rTMS) alone, Cognitive Processing Therapy (CPT) alone, or rTMS combined with CPT can improve clinical outcomes.

We are looking for Veterans between the age of 18-60 years who suffer from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Potential participants will be screened by phone for eligibility. We expect volunteers will be in this research study for about 15 months. About 12 weeks will spent in the treatment portion of the study, and the remaining time will be for periodically monitoring. Volunteers will need to come for 18 planned study visits. Some study visits may be longer or shorter depending on how quickly the clinical evaluations are completed.

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
