## Congratulations, Class of 2011

Graduation day arrived May 21 for the 114 members of the Florida State University College of Medicine's Class of 2011. The Fort Pierce Regional Campus, which opened in April 2007 on the campus of Indian River State College, was home for 15 of those graduates for the past two years. They completed their third and fourth years of training here on the Treasure Coast, working one-on-one with many of the over 200 FSU clerkship faculty physicians in this area.

Three of the graduates from the Fort Pierce campus received prestigious awards at the Tallahassee ceremony. **Stephen Nobles** was recognized for earning membership in the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society. **Ashley Kelley** and **Stephanie Reed** were also recognized for earning membership in the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society, and both received the American Medical Women's Association Glasgow-Rubin Achievement Citation. Stephanie was also chosen, from among the 15 Fort Pierce graduates, for the Dean's Award. This award is presented by each regional campus to the most outstanding graduate in recognition of dedication, compassion and academic excellence.

In early May, the graduates gathered with the campus dean, Dr. Randall Bertolette, community board members, staff and physician faculty at the Pelican Yacht Club to celebrate their accomplishments. 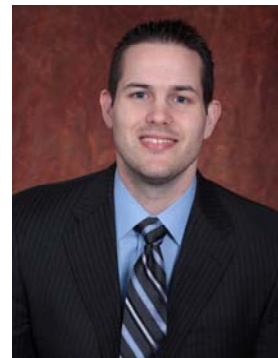

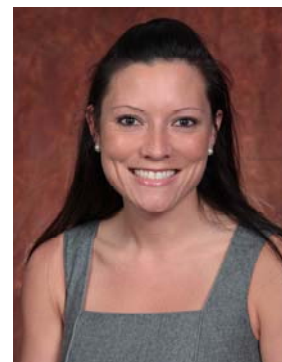

## FSU Fort Pierce Board Member Earns Award



The American Hospital Association (AHA), in partnership with the Florida Hospital Association (FHA), has given **Mark Robitaille**, president and chief executive officer of Martin Memorial Health Systems, the 2011 AHA Grassroots Champion Award. Mr. Robitaille is being recognized for his leadership in generating grassroots and community activity in support of the hospital’s mission. The AHA Champion Award was created to recognize those hospital leaders who most effectively educate elected officials on how major issues affect the hospital’s vital role in the community, who have done an exemplary job in broadening the base of community support for the hospital and who are tireless advocates for the hospital and its patients.

## High-Schoolers Sample Med School

Addressing disparities in Florida’s physician workforce requires starting early – long before a medical school’s admissions process begins. At the Florida State University College of Medicine, part of that effort is a summer “mini med school” for high-school students. Sixty-one students from across Florida are participating in one of the college’s three Summer Institute sessions. Two students come from **Jensen Beach High School**: juniors **Rachel Candela** and **Emily Larsen**. Two others attend **Clark Advanced Learning Center** in Stuart: juniors **Kara Russell** and **Maryna Wakeman**.

The College of Medicine’s six regional campuses – in Daytona Beach, Fort Pierce, Orlando, Pensacola, Sarasota and Tallahassee – invite students from their area high schools to apply. “Encouraging students at a young age to think about a career in medicine is a great way to increase the chances of having the physicians we’ll need in the Treasure Coast area,” said Randall Bertollette, M.D., dean of the College of Medicine’s Fort Pierce Regional Campus. This year, individuals and corporations in various parts of the state sponsored some of the registered participants, recognizing the value in trying to help create future physicians for their community. In the Treasure Coast area, the **Robert F. and Eleonora W. McCabe Foundation** generously donated the funds to provide a scholarship for one of the students representing the Fort Pierce Regional Campus, Kara Russell.

“Our goal for the Summer Institute is to recruit students from rural, underserved and minority backgrounds and, at the same time, recruit students from other parts of Florida who have a desire to work in medically underserved areas,” said Thesla Berne-Anderson, director of college and pre-college outreach at the College of Medicine.

Participants shadow physicians and medical students, visit rural health centers and get college testing and application advice. They also attend faculty lectures on topics such as medical ethics, migrant health care and doctor-patient relations. In several activities, the participants go through training similar to what real med students face. The focus on minority recruitment stems from the college’s founding mission to help train physicians for Florida’s traditionally underserved populations. A 2007 study indicated that fewer than 5 percent of Florida’s practicing physicians are African-American and 15 percent are Hispanic. By contrast, the U.S. Census Bureau classifies nearly 16 percent of Florida’s overall population as African-American and more than 20 percent as Hispanic. As Florida’s population continues to grow and its number of practicing physicians declines, people who were underserved from the beginning suffer all the more.

Eighteen eager medical students arrived on the Treasure Coast in June to begin their third year of medical school at the Fort Pierce Regional Campus. After undergoing three days of orientation, hospital visits and paperwork, they hit the ground running to start their clinical rotations in pediatrics, surgery, obstetrics/gynecology, family medicine, psychiatry, and internal medicine. In their fourth year, they will tackle emergency medicine, advanced internal medicine, geriatrics, advanced family medicine, and electives. All of our students work under the guidance of our dean, eight clerkship directors, and more than 200 clerkship faculty physicians in our community. Welcome!

## Class of 2014

At the end of their first year of medical school, every FSU medical student completes a three-week Summer Clinical Practicum course in May. This required course is an experiential learning activity providing opportunities for students to practice and improve basic clinical skills. The goals of the course include understanding the patient as a person, appreciating the concept of a health care team, understanding how a given community can affect a patient's health, and beginning lifelong learning with reflection and self-evaluation. Students are assigned to a rural, an urban underserved, or a geriatric setting to participate in patient care activities under the direct supervision of a primary care physician. The first-year students work at locations throughout the state of Florida and into southern Georgia with clerkship faculty from all six FSU College of Medicine regional campuses.
