#### NIH Alters Course on Grant Support Index, Launches Next Generation of Researchers Initiative

At the **June 8, 2017** NIH Advisory Committee to the Director (ACD) [meeting](#), NIH leadership announced they are changing plans to implement the Grant Support Index (GSI), a proposal to limit the number of NIH research project grants that an investigator could hold at any one time. In place of the GSI, NIH [launched](#) a new initiative to directly support early-stage investigators (ESIs) and, especially, mid-career investigators (MSIs) with additional funds to be set aside across NIH. Individual institutes and centers (ICs) will determine how to reprioritize funds to support ESIs/MSIs most effectively. In their [presentation](#), NIH Director Francis Collins, MD, PhD, and Deputy Director Lawrence Tabak, DDS, PhD, said that the new "Next Generation of Researchers Initiative" would dedicate \$210 million in the first year to support ESIs and MSIs whose grant applications score well but fall just outside of paylines. After five years, the program would reach over \$1.1 billion. The name of the program is derived from language in the 21st Century Cures Act, reflecting Congress's support for new scientists. The decision was based on [feedback](#) from researchers and academic leaders, although, as [reported](#) by Jocelyn Kaiser in Science, the proposed GSI also had support of many other investigators and trainee scientists. ### NIH: Important eRA Account Emails Headed Your Way

In late **July 2017**, NIH will begin sending notifications to individuals who likely have more than one Commons account in an effort to improve the accuracy and reliability of the eRA Commons Account data. For security, these emails will only include instructions on how to determine whether you have duplicate accounts. The National Institutes of Health (NIH) has released a revised Notice to inform the research community that NIH is extending the effective date of the NIH Policy on the Use of a Single Institutional Review Board for Multi-Site Research to **January 25, 2018**. The policy will apply to all competing grant applications for due dates on or after **January 25, 2018**. ### Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs Funding for Fiscal Year 2017

The Fiscal Year 2017 Department of Defense Appropriations Act provides research funding for peer reviewed programs managed by the Department of Defense office of Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs (CDMRP). Comprehensive Program Announcements will be released throughout 2017. The Program Announcements include detailed descriptions of funding mechanisms, evaluation criteria, submission requirements, and deadlines. All programs have a required Pre-Application. ### The Brain & Behavior Research Foundation 2017 NARSAD Distinguished Investigator Grant

The Brain & Behavior Research Foundation is now accepting online applications for the 2017 NARSAD Distinguished Investigator Grant. This program provides support for experienced basic and/or clinical investigators (full professor or equivalent) and offers up to \$100,000 for a one (1) year period (extensions to the grant will be considered). Research must be relevant to schizophrenia, mood disorders or other serious mental illnesses including research with anxiety, bipolar disorders, personality disorders or early and/or late onset of severe brain and behavior disorders. These grants are among the most competitive in mental health research and demonstrate the power of investigator-initiated research to bring out

### Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute New Research Funding Opportunities

The Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) is now accepting Letters of Intent (LOIs) for five PCORI Funding Announcements (PFAs). These include two targeted announcements: one on treating opioid use disorders among pregnant women, and one on managing symptoms in patients with advanced illness. PCORI is also accepting LOIs through the Pragmatic Clinical Studies program and a limited funding announcement on dissemination and implementation. ### National Multiple Sclerosis Society Research Grants

A key objective of the National Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Society is to drive change so that people have effective treatment choices and solutions to the challenges of living with MS. Their Strategic Plan calls for expanding investments and worldwide collaboration to accelerate research progress toward this goal. The Society provides grant funding to support the brightest scientists and physicians exploring questions underlying MS. The Society is currently accepting pre-applications for their Research Grants, which support studies related to multiple sclerosis that may serve to advance their mission of stopping MS progression, restoring function and improving quality of life, and preventing MS. ### Alzheimer's Drug Discovery Foundation Request For Proposals: Preclinical Drug Discovery

The Alzheimer's Drug Discovery Foundation (ADDF) seeks to fill the critical translational funding gap between basic research and later stage drug development by funding promising preclinical drug discovery programs relevant to Alzheimer's disease, related dementias, and cognitive aging. Program areas of particular interest include new chemical compounds for Alzheimer's disease, preclinical proof-of-concept, and drug repurposing. The ADDF typically supports one year of research at a time, with potential for future follow-on funding. Funding can range from \$150,000-\$600,000 for a pre-clinical project depending on the stage of research and must be justified based on the scientific work plan. In some cases, multi-year proposals can be considered. The required letter of intent deadline is **July 31, 2017**. [More Information.](#)

### Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation Strategic Research Agreements

The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation's (JDRF) Strategic Research Agreements provide research funding for single or multiple investigators to address critical gaps and challenges and potential breakthroughs in Type 1 diabetes research. The Strategic Research Agreement is a partnership between investigator(s) and JDRF Scientists to help address roadblocks and accelerate JDRF's mission through support of cutting-edge scientific investigation. Further, this mechanism embodies cooperative development of a research plan, interim quarterly reporting on milestones and interaction with JDRF scientists prior to and during the award period. The budget and duration of funding are variable and continued funding is based on satisfactory effort and quarterly progress on milestones. Submission of an application requires permission from JDRF and is initiated with a Project Concept submitted to the JDRF. The deadline for submission of the Project Concept is **August 1, 2017**. ### AGA - R. Robert & Sally Funderburg Research Award in Gastric Cancer

The American Gastroenterological Association (AGA) is requesting proposals for the R. Robert & Sally Funderburg Research Award in Gastric Cancer. The objective of this award is to support an established investigator in the field of gastric biology whose research will enhance the fundamental understanding of gastric cancer pathobiology to ultimately prevent or develop a cure for the disease. The proposed research must focus on gastric cancer research, including:

- The fields of gastric mucosal cell biology
- Regeneration and regulation of cell growth (not as they relate to peptic ulcer disease or repair)
- Inflammation (including *Helicobacter pylori*) as precancerous lesions
- Genetics of gastric carcinoma
- Oncogenes in gastric epithelial malignancies
- Epidemiology of gastric cancer
- Etiology of gastric epithelial malignancies
- Clinical research in the diagnosis or treatment of gastric carcinoma

### Mesothelioma Applied Research Foundation Grants for Mesothelioma Research

The Meso Foundation (formerly known as MARF) is a non-profit dedicated to ending the suffering caused by mesothelioma. The Meso Foundation's research grant program offers grants for two years up to \$50,000 per year. Eligible projects may relate to benchwork, translational or clinical research that is not presently funded and may be conducted through any not-for-profit academic, medical or research institution. All levels and degrees of scientists are encouraged to apply. Encouraged projects include, but are not limited to: 1) Strategies for early detection and prevention of mesothelioma; 2) Definition of targetable differences between normal and transformed mesothelium and development of novel strategies for treatment; 3) Determination of clinical/molecular determinants for prognosis; and 4) Therapeutic intervention. ### Florida Department of Health Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Funding Opportunity Announcements

The Florida Department of Health (FDOH) has released the FY 2017-2018 Funding Opportunity Announcements (FOAs) for the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program and the Bankhead Coley Cancer Research Program. The purpose of the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program is to support research initiatives that address the health care problems of Floridians in the areas of tobacco-related cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, and pulmonary disease. The Bankhead Coley Cancer Research Program's purpose is to advance progress toward cures for cancer through grants awarded through a peer-reviewed, competitive process. This Program shall provide grants for cancer research to further the search for cures for cancer. Letters of intent for both programs are due **August 11, 2017**. The Elsa U. Pardee Foundation funds research to investigators in United States non-profit institutions proposing research directed toward identifying new treatments or cures for cancer. The Foundation particularly encourages grant applications for a one year period which will allow establishment of capabilities of new cancer researchers, or new cancer approaches by established cancer researchers. It is anticipated that this early stage funding by the Foundation may lead to subsequent and expanded support using government agency funding. Project relevance to cancer detection, treatment, or cure should be clearly identified. By design, there are no limits set on the grant amount that can be requested. The program encourages creative, outside-the-box thinkers to pursue exciting and innovative ideas in any area of biomedical research relevant to the NIH mission. From any on-campus computer, go to <http://pivot.cos.com>. FSU's IP addresses will be recognized by Pivot, so you can start searching for funding opportunities right away. Creating a Pivot account is easy—at the website, click “Sign up” in the upper right corner. Once registered, you can log in with a Pivot username and password anytime, anywhere. Logging in allows you to manage active or tracked funding opportunities, save searches, share opportunities, and search for potential collaborators. Username and password access is necessary when you are off-campus or when you want to save a funding record or funding search.

## SUBMITTING PROPOSALS FOR GRANTS AND CONTRACTS

### College of Medicine, Office of Research Administration (Med-RA)

**Help us help you!** The sooner you let us know of your intent to submit a proposal for extramural funding, the **sooner we can help you navigate** the paths to a successful submission. Our goals are to assist you with the CoM requirements and those of FSU Sponsored Research Administration (SRA), or in the case of private funding, the FSU Research Foundation (FSURF); minimize the administrative burden; and meet sponsor guidelines in a seamless, integrated fashion.

SRA/FSURF requires "complete" proposals three (3) business days in advance of the sponsor's deadline. *Please note that generally our office works on a first in, first out basis.* If you contact us at least 30 days in advance, together we can identify, gather, or create the elements/components, then assemble the application by the SRA/FSURF deadline for institutional approval. The goal is to have all the elements needed to assemble a complete proposal for SRA/FSURF no later than 10 business days before the sponsor's deadline.
