NIH Standard Due Dates

All proposal elements are due to our office ten (10) business days in advance so we can secure all COM approvals and help you assemble the complete proposal by the University's three (3) business days deadline for institutional approval. <u>More Information.</u>

HHS Proposes a Further Delay to the Common Rule

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and 16 other federal departments and agencies issued a <u>Notice of</u> <u>Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)</u> to delay the general compliance date for the revised Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects ("the Common Rule") for an additional six months, from July 19, 2018, to January 21, 2019. As discussed during the 2018 GRAND Spring Conference, the notice was issued to "provide additional time to regulated entities for the preparations necessary to implement the 2018 requirements." The AAMC along with Association of American Universities (AAU) and the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) had requested a delay in a <u>March 19 letter</u>. The NPRM <u>seeks comment</u> by May 21 on the new proposed compliance date and whether to allow institutions to implement three "burden reducing" provisions included in the revised rule prior to the 2019 general compliance date. FSU Procurement Services Announcement

Florida State University, in coordination with Sponsored Research, will be implementing new federal regulations im-

pacting procurement of goods and services on **July 1, 2018** (start of fiscal year 2019). The regulations, known as Uniform Guidance, are issued by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and there are a number of reforms and changes for institutions that receive federal grant funding. The primary impact will be the added due diligence required for small purchases in excess of the micro-purchase threshold (\$10K), and especially for Sole Source purchases, which will require a more compliant screening and sourcing process. In addition, institutions will be required to have internal policies and procedures that define conflicts of interest for staff engaging in procurement decisions and organizational conflicts of interest. In accordance with FSU CoM Research Policy, the Office of Research Administration <u>should be</u> notified of all potential proposals (including letters of intent) so that we can help COM researchers navigate the application process and ensure appropriate approvals are secured. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Grant Program

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Center for Mental Health Services (CMHS) is accepting applications for fiscal year (FY) 2018 Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Grant Program. Eligible children for services include children from birth to not more than 12 years of age, who are at risk for, show early signs of, or have been diagnosed with a mental illness including a serious emotional disturbance. The purpose of this program is to improve outcomes for these children by developing, maintaining, or enhancing infant and early childhood mental health promotion, intervention, and treatment services, including: (1) programs for infants and children at significant risk of developing, showing early signs of, or having been diagnosed with a mental illness, including a serious emotional disturbance (SED) and/or symptoms that may be indicative of a developing SED in children with a history of in utero exposure to substances such as opioids, stimulants or other drugs that may impact development; and (2) multigenerational therapy and other services that strengthen positive caregiving relationships. SAMHSA expects this program will increase access to a full range of infant and early childhood services and build workforce capacity for individuals serving children from birth to age 12. American Heart Association (AHA) / Allen Initiative in Brain Health and Cognitive Impairment

The purpose of this research initiative is to discover and fund highly-promising teams of investigators who will expand the frontiers of bioscience, pursuing creative, transformative ideas with the potential to move brain health and cognitive impairment science forward. The AHA and Paul G. Allen Frontiers Group, with additional funding contributors including the Oskar Fischer Project, will grant a competitive basic science research award(s) of up to \$43 million over eight years to one or more highly inspiring and innovative integrated team(s). New frontiers of discovery in brain health, and more specifically in cognitive impairment, will be opened when expertise and novel advances are shared and leveraged among basic and clinical cerebrovascular scientists and neuroscientists. Such integrative studies have the potential to bring truly novel directions of inquiry to the current incremental progress in the field of neurodegeneration and Alzheimer's Disease research, with potentially exponential or transformational new insights. Applicants are expected to assemble an integrative team that will leverage diverse skills and perspectives to address a compelling selection or combination of compelling relevant topics. National Institute for Health Care Management (NIHCM) Foundation Investigator-Initiated Health Services Research Grants

NIHCM Foundation supports innovative investigator-initiated research with high potential to inform improvements to the U.S. health care system. Projects must advance the existing knowledge base in the areas of health care financing, delivery, management and/or policy. NIHCM Foundation is making approximately \$400,000 available and expects to fund 7 to 8 studies from this amount. The required letter of inquiry is due **July 9, 2018.** <u>More information.</u>

Alzheimer's Drug Discovery Foundation Drug Discovery Program

The Alzheimer's Drug Discovery Foundation (ADDF) has long recognized the need to bridge the translational funding gap between early-stage drug discovery and clinical development for Alzheimer's disease, related dementias, and cognitive aging by supporting promising therapeutic approaches. The ADDF's Drug Discovery RFP focuses on supporting programs that aim to: Advance novel lead molecules to the clinical candidate selection stage (defined as compounds suitable for IND-enabling studies); or Build preclinical evidence in relevant animal models for repurposed/repositioned drugs. The average award is \$150,000-\$600,000 based on stage and scope of research. For studies requiring additional support, cofunding from other funding agencies or investors is encouraged. Burroughs Wellcome Fund Investigators in the Pathogenesis of Infectious Disease Program

The Investigators in the Pathogenesis of Infectious Disease program provides opportunities for assistant professors to bring multidisciplinary approaches to the study of human infectious diseases. The goal of the program is to provide opportunities for accomplished investigators still early in their careers to study what happens at the points where the systems of humans and potentially infectious agents connect. The program supports research that sheds light on the fundamentals that affect the outcomes of these encounters: how colonization, infection, commensalism, and other relationships play out at levels ranging from molecular interactions to systemic ones. From this year forward, microbiome-related proposals must be infectious disease focused to compete well in this program. PATH is a highly competitive award program that provides \$500,000 over a period of five years. The awards are intended to give recipients the freedom and flexibility to pursue new avenues of inquiry, stimulating higher risk research projects that hold potential for significantly advancing understanding of how infectious diseases work and how health is maintained. Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Healthy Eating Research: Building Evidence to Promote Health and Well-Being Among Children

Healthy Eating Research (HER) is a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) national program, which supports research on policy, systems, and environmental (PSE) strategies with strong potential to promote the health and well-being of children at a population level. Specifically, HER aims to help all children achieve optimal nutrition and a healthy weight. HER grantmaking focuses on children and adolescents from birth to 18, and their families, with a priority on lower-income and racial and ethnic minority populations that are at-risk of poor nutrition and obesity. Findings are expected to advance RWJF's efforts to ensure that all children and their families have the opportunity and resources to experience the best physical, social, and emotional health possible, promote health equity, and build a Culture of Health. Healthy Eating Research issues calls for proposals (CFPs) to solicit scientifically rigorous, solution-oriented proposals from investigators representing diverse disciplines and backgrounds. This CFP is for two types of awards aimed at providing advocates, decisionmakers, and policymakers with evidence to promote the health and well-being of children through nutritious foods and beverages. The award types are Round 11, small- and large-scale grants. The two funding opportunities are described in more detail beginning on page 2 of the CFP. 
Research Fellowships for Medical Students

SUBMITTING PROPOSALS FOR GRANTS AND CONTRACTS

College of Medicine, Office of Research Administration (Med-RA)

Help us help you! The sooner you let us know of your intent to submit a proposal for extramural funding, the **sooner we can help you navigate** the paths to a successful submission. Our goals are to assist you with the CoM requirements and those of FSU Sponsored Research Administration (SRA), or in the case of private funding, the FSU Research Foundation (FSURF); minimize the administrative burden; and meet sponsor guidelines in a seamless, integrated fashion.

SRA/FSURF requires "complete" proposals three (3) business days in advance of the sponsor's deadline. *Please note that generally our office works on a first in, first out basis.* If you contact us at least 30 days in advance, together we can identify, gather, or create the elements/components, then assemble the application by the SRA/FSURF deadline for institutional approval. The goal is to have all the elements needed to assemble a complete proposal for SRA/FSURF no later than 10 business days before the sponsor's deadline.
