#### **NIH Standard Due Dates**

Cycle 2 will begin on May 25, 2018 and standard due dates for common mechanisms are as follows:

- R01 (new) June 5
- K Series (new) June 12

- R01 (renewals, resubmissions, revisions) July 5
- K Series (renewals, resubmissions, revisions) July 12

Help us help you! The sooner you let us know of your intent to submit a proposal for extramural funding (30 days is recommended), the sooner we can help you navigate the paths to a successful submission. All proposal elements are due to our office ten (10) business days in advance so we can secure all COM approvals and help you assemble the complete proposal by the University's three (3) business days deadline for institutional approval. <u>More Information</u>.

#### HHS Proposes a Further Delay to the Common Rule

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and 16 other federal departments and agencies issued a <u>Notice of</u> <u>Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)</u> to delay the general compliance date for the revised Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects ("the Common Rule") for an additional six months, from July 19, 2018, to January 21, 2019. As discussed during the 2018 GRAND Spring Conference, the notice was issued to "provide additional time to regulated entities for the preparations necessary to implement the 2018 requirements." The AAMC along with Association of American Universities (AAU) and the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) had requested a delay in a <u>March 19 letter</u>. The NPRM <u>seeks comment</u> by May 21 on the new proposed compliance date and whether to allow institutions to implement three "burden reducing" provisions included in the revised rule prior to the 2019 general compliance date. #### **FSU Procurement Services Announcement**

Florida State University, in coordination with Sponsored Research, will be implementing new federal regulations im-

pacting procurement of goods and services on **July 1, 2018** (start of fiscal year 2019). The regulations, known as Uniform Guidance, are issued by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and there are a number of reforms and changes for institutions that receive federal grant funding. The primary impact will be the added due diligence required for small purchases in excess of the micro-purchase threshold (\$10K), and especially for Sole Source purchases, which will require a more compliant screening and sourcing process. In addition, institutions will be required to have internal policies and procedures that define conflicts of interest for staff engaging in procurement decisions and organizational conflicts of interest. # Global Healthy Living Foundation and Pfizer Independent Grants for Learning & Change Request for Proposal: Accelerating the Detection, Diagnosis and Initial Treatment of Psoriatic Arthritis

It is Pfizer's intent to support projects that focus on improving the early detection, diagnosis and initial treatment (during the first six months following diagnosis) of adults with psoriatic arthritis (PsA) in partnership with health care providers in the community. Priority will be given to proposals that are able to: Leverage Arthritis Power<sup>™</sup> or other validated tools and/or mobile (e.g., smartphone) applications for screening and data collection; Ensure healthcare system-based changes; and Demonstrate a direct impact on patient care. Programs should focus on accelerating detection, diagnosis and initial treatment of PsA by testing innovative healthcare system-based changes. Programs limited to a focus on one treatment will not be eligible for consideration. It is expected that the proposed project will be evidence-based and the proposed research/evaluation will follow generally accepted scientific principles. During review, the intended outcome of the project is given careful consideration and, if appropriate based on the project goal, projects with the maximum likelihood to directly impact patient care in a measurable way will be given high priority. The required letter of intent is due **June 1, 2018.** More information.

#### Vilcek Prizes for Creative Promise in Biomedical Sciences

The Vilcek Foundation will award three prizes of \$50,000 each to young (not more than 38 years old as of December 18, 2018) foreign-born biomedical scientists who demonstrate outstanding early achievement. From any on-campus computer, go to <u>http://pivot.cos.com</u>. FSU's IP addresses will be recognized by Pivot, so you can start searching for funding opportunities right away. Creating a Pivot account is easy—at the website, click "Sign up" in the upper right corner. Once registered, you can log in with a Pivot username and password anytime, anywhere. Log-ging in allows you to manage active or tracked funding opportunities, save searches, share opportunities, and search for potential collaborators. Username and password access is necessary when you are off-campus or when you want to save a funding record or funding search.

## SUBMITTING PROPOSALS FOR GRANTS AND CONTRACTS

## College of Medicine, Office of Research Administration (Med-RA)

**Help us help you!** The sooner you let us know of your intent to submit a proposal for extramural funding, the **sooner we can help you navigate** the paths to a successful submission. Our goals are to assist you with the CoM requirements and those of FSU Sponsored Research Administration (SRA), or in the case of private funding, the FSU Research Foundation (FSURF); minimize the administrative burden; and meet sponsor guidelines in a seamless, integrated fashion.

SRA/FSURF requires "complete" proposals three (3) business days in advance of the sponsor's deadline. *Please note that generally our office works on a first in, first out basis.* If you contact us at least 30 days in advance, together we can identify, gather, or create the elements/components, then assemble the application by the SRA/FSURF deadline for institutional approval. The goal is to have all the elements needed to assemble a complete proposal for SRA/FSURF no later than 10 business days before the sponsor's deadline.
