

Roles and Responsibilities for Clerkship Faculty in the FSU College of Medicine

Clerkship Faculty: The clinical faculty teaching 3rd and 4th year rotations at each of the regional campuses and rural training sites.

Duties and Responsibilities:

I. Student/Academic Responsibilities

- A. Responsible for teaching FSU COM medical students in the required or elective rotations under the direction of the clerkship director and campus dean.
- B. Actively teaches during the clerkship by providing clinical learning opportunities and developmentally appropriate responsibilities during the progress of the clerkship.
- C. Assigns students to a variety of patients and experiences to meet the objectives of the educational program
- D. Provides feedback regularly to the student
- E. Provides mid-clerkship formative feedback to students, and completes final student evaluations in a timely fashion.
- F. Advises students regarding educational issues
- G. Implements University policies regarding student privacy
- H. Conducts an orientation with student at beginning of clerkship in which expectations, learning needs, etc. are discussed
- I. Reads and abides by AAMC Learner/Faculty Compact with Students
- J. Follows core curriculum objectives provided by FSU COM

II. Faculty/Administrative Responsibilities

- A. Participates in faculty development programs as required by the Faculty Development Policy.
- B. Maintains licensure in Florida or other state(s) as appropriate.
- C. Abides by University policies regarding faculty
- D. Follows core curriculum objectives provided by FSU COM.
- E. Attends faculty orientation and other meetings as called by the clerkship directors or regional campus dean
- F. Communicates regularly with clerkship directors and Regional Campus Dean
- G. Educates office staff and allied health professionals in his/her office relative to educational functions and procedures consistent with being an office teaching site.
- H. Is encouraged to participate in community-based research

Evaluation of the Roles and Responsibilities of Clerkship Faculty:

- 1. The Clerkship Director will monitor the faculty member for each assigned student and provide feedback at the end of the clerkship.
- 2. Each assigned student will provide feedback on the faculty member through the MEDedIQ survey at the end of each rotation.

Qualifications:

Essential:

- 1. MD or DO degree, ABMS Board certification
- 2. Florida or appropriate state license
- 3. Access to a practice environment with a patient mix that meets the requirements of the clerkship experience
- 4. Must support the mission of the college to educate and develop exemplary physicians who practice patient-centered health care, discover and advance knowledge and are responsive to community needs especially through service to elder, rural, minority, and underserved populations.

Desirable:

- 1. Medical student education experience
- 2. Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- 3. Ability to communicate using the information technology network
- 4. Experience with use of electronic health records.

Benefits:

- Receive a Clinical Faculty Appointment with the FSU College of Medicine.
- Receive a stipend for each student assigned.
- Free access to all COM Medical Library resources and services (e.g. MDConsult, PubMed, etc.).
- Faculty development programs provided to enhance teaching skills, with free CME when applicable.
- Signage designating ambulatory office as an FSU COM teaching site.
- Student assistance in patient care process and/or research
- Patients receive individual attention from student's presence.
- Students can be a resource for information by conducting literature searches, helping preceptor learn about electronic resources, etc.
- Continuous opportunity to learn ("To teach is to learn twice.")
- Opportunity to mentor and influence the next generation of physicians.
- Opportunity to fulfill desire to teach.
- Opportunity for renewal and refreshment of knowledge base.
- Identification with the medical school is a positive impression on patients.
- Positive reactions from patients about being seen by a medical student.
- Opportunity to interact with physician colleagues around the issues of teaching and learning
- Opportunity to join the FSU College of Medicine Clinical Research Network.
